

WCNA Street Tree Planting Application

PLANT TREES... Make West Central COOL

Deadline for submission is June 25 for planting in the fall.

The West Central Neighborhood Association (WCNA) works with our residents and the City of Fort Wayne to plant trees in the park strips between the curb and the sidewalk. The WCNA will pay the applicant's share of the cost charged by the City's Street Tree Planting Program, Your new shade tree(s) will have a 2-inch diameter trunk and be from 8 to 14 feet tall, depending on the variety.

After we receive your application...

West Central volunteers will submit your application to the City Forestry Department, and their experts will evaluate your application to see if your request can be accommodated. If planting space is available, planting locations will be marked with an **orange V** on the adjacent curb or street.

Once your new tree is planted...

Please water your new tree when the weather is dry. This is especially helpful during the first summer after the tree is planted.

Tree Placement No-No's

We want to make sure your new tree(s) are placed so it/they will not become a nuisance in the future. Please check your request against the following list to see if there might be a potential problem. The City may not be able to plant trees in the following situations:

- On private property. The City can plant only on public property.
- Under utility wires.
- In a park strip less than 5 feet in any direction.
- Within 40 feet of an intersecting street, alley or commercial driveway, or within 15 feet of a residential driveway.
- Within 40 feet of the trunk of another nearby tree on the street or in an adjacent yard (this is somewhat flexible).
- Within 10 feet of a streetlight, fire hydrant or traffic signal pole.
- Within 3 feet of curbs and/or sidewalks in poor condition.

Suitable Trees for Fort Wayne Streets

The city maintains a <u>list</u> of suitable street trees, and the list below also includes of some of the best varieties of the hardiest trees for planting along our city streets. The availability of each species differs from one season to the next.

American Linden	Northern Pin Oak

Sugar Maple	Heritage Oak

Red Maple (very limited)	Sweetgum (limited quantity)
