Meeting Minutes February 19, 2024, 7:00pm

Attendance: 26 people

Joel Sauer (President) welcomed everyone to the meeting and reviewed the mission and vision of the WCNA:

The vision of the West Central Neighborhood Association is to create a friendly environment that is rich in history, culture, diversity, and community that is valued by its residents, business owners, and visitors.

Priorities for 2024: Joel

- Survey was sent out to the neighborhood for our WNCA priorities and we received about 80 responses.
- The board used the input from the survey and at the last membership meeting to narrow down priorities
- Priorities are as follows:
 - Historic Preservation (always)
 - Expansion of existing member programs with a focus on crime deterrents.
 We will make a greater effort to increase awareness. We have dedicated additional funding for 2024 as well. Programs include: home beautification, sidewalks & curbs repair/replacement, Yard & Park Strip Trees, and Home Security (update to this! Package delivery boxes are now included!)
 - Liveability Improvements, including bike and pedestrian friendliness (Neighborhood Greenways, Thieme drive changes, connection to Moody Park) and Property Improvements (empty homes and buildings, problem rentals, unkempt properties)
 - Side note concern about new traffic pattern at end of Thieme- a small group of board members and neighbors met with the city. We were reminded that emergency vehicles do not have to obey one-ways and can get to hard to reach places more easily
 - Landlord event

Historic Preservation Committee Update: Craig Johnson

- Three purposes: education, advocacy, and vigilance
- Official Statement: The purpose of the West Central Historic Preservation Committee is to foster improvement of the West Central neighborhood through preservation of historic structures and places using an established revitalization process; promotion of compatible residential and commercial growth and development; procurement and rehabilitation of historic or architecturally relevant vulnerable neighborhood structures; education and promotion of local, state, and federal historic preservation resources; and public education about West Central history to build both connectedness and stewardship.
- Meets on the first Tuesday of the month at the downtown library. Craig invited anyone interested to come and sit in.
- Reminder: if you see something historically inappropriate happening, please let a member of the Committee or the Board so that we can communicate with the City
- ARCH is part of Indiana Landmarks there are grants available they are talking about putting on a seminar about what it means to be on the National Historic Register vs the Local Historic District. Education could also include the Indiana Residential Historic Tax Credit. (Joel suggested recording these and making them available on the website)
- Suggestion to add links on our website to State historic standards
- Question: do landscape changes require local HPC approval? Yes. Just reach out to Creager via email.

Financial Update: George Taylor

- Presented the 2024 WCNA budget
- We are decreasing the projected income for 2024 due to record income from the 2023 Home Tour.
- Increased budgeted amounts for the Programs.
- Anticipating a net balance of \sim \$5,000 for the year.
- He has copies of the budget available
- We are hiring CPA Targeted Solutions, who works exclusively with nonprofits, who
 will help us with our books. This will help keep us secure in the event that
 something would happen to our Treasurer. The CPA will help with quarterly
 statements and tax filings.
